SEWER RATE INCREASE NOTIFICATION

Lake County Public Works Department has notified the Village that the Lake County Board approved wholesale sanitary sewer rate increases for customer's tributary to the Northeast Central System and the Northwest System. These increases are passed onto the residents and businesses. This increase is effective January 1, 2019 and will show on your February utility bill.

Northeast Central Sewer System customers are comprised of the subdivisions of Misty Hill Farms, Deer Point Trails, The Sanctuary and The Settlement. The sewer rate will increase from \$5.481 per thousand gallons to \$5.551 per thousand gallons. The total increase is \$0.07 per thousand gallons.

Northwest Sewer System customers are comprised of the subdivisions of Union Square Townhomes, Cranberry Lake (both single family homes and all townhomes) and the Commercial corridor on Routes 120 & 134. The sewer rate will increase from \$3.67 per thousand gallons to \$3.70 per thousand gallons. The total increase is \$0.03 per thousand gallons.

Don't Let Your Pipes Freeze

Keep the house temperature around 60 degrees as this will help ensure that those colder areas where water pipes run through garages and crawl spaces do not experience a pipe burst.

Please note that parking on ANY Village Street (except for Holiday Lane) between 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. is prohibited or when there is 2 inches or more of snowfall.
