# WELCOME

**WELCOME!** Hainesville is a unique and eco-friendly community. It is the oldest village in Lake County, established in 1847. Our lake was created by glaciers. Our water comes from our own aquifers, which are an underground water supply. We have over 20 ponds and many wetlands throughout the village. We are continually working to restore our woodlands, open spaces, and wetlands to their natural beauty.

Our location allows us to take advantage of the services of two other communities. We have reciprocal agreements with the Round Lake Area and Grayslake Libraries and Park Districts. Some of our students attend Round Lake Area schools and others attend Grayslake schools. The dividing line is Hainesville Road. It also divides us into two zip codes. The east side of Hainesville Road is 60030; the west side is 60073. We are served by the Greater Round Lake Area and Grayslake Fire Protection Districts. Our Grayslake/Hainesville Police Department services the entire community.

## HAINESVILLE HISTORY

In the year 1847, by special permission from the Illinois legislature through the efforts of Elijah M. Haines, a charter was granted for the Town of Hainesville. In 1902, an election was held changing Hainesville from a town to a village.

Elijah Haines produced the first plat map of Lake County while working as a school master for the first school in Littlefort, now Waukegan. Hainesville's first schoolhouse was a log cabin built in 1846. This schoolhouse also held church services for the residents. Hainesville also once housed a train station and a post office. The reason Hainesville is so small is that Elijah Haines envisioned that it would house people who would supply services to the farmers in one convenient place. Therefore, Hainesville had a post office, general store, blacksmith and school.

In 1847, Haines met Abraham Lincoln at the Republican Convention in Chicago. In 1848, Hainesville

became a toll road stop on the predecessor of Belvidere Road (Route 120) formerly known as Old Plank Road. The wooden plank road was built to link Waukegan to McHenry County.

Hainesville once had a small private cemetery, which is supposed to be located south of Cranberry Lake. There have been many attempts to locate the cemetery, but all have been unsuccessful.

The population of Hainesville remained under 200 until the early 1990s when construction of the present subdivisions was developed.

# VILLAGE GOVERNMENT

The village board consists of a mayor and six trustees, each with a four-year term. However, three trustees are elected, at large, every two years.

Village board meetings are held at 6:30 pm on the fourth Tuesday each month, except November and December (check website for dates). All board meetings can be seen on YouTube. # VILLAGE SERVICES

## COMMUNICATIONS

The Village of Hainesville is committed to open and transparent communication. It offers a variety of ways for residents to obtain information about public meetings, upcoming events, village ordinances, activities and more. The most detailed information of village news, events, services and links to our Facebook and YouTube pages can be found on our website: [www.hainesville.org](http://www.hainesville.org). All of our board meetings can be seen on YouTube. You can sign up on our website to receive village announcements and our monthly newsletter. The newsletter provides a calendar of upcoming events, updates on Hainesville news and other important information. Current and past issues are also available at [www.hainesville.org](http://www.hainesville.org). However, **the most important sign up is for our CTY calls**. This service informs residents of hazards, possible severe weather and disaster information, as well as important upcoming events and other announcements. A **CTY** call can save your family's lives. You may sign up on the village website.

## LEAF COLLECTION

Leaf collection provides residents a convenient way to dispose of leaves in the fall. Pick up schedules are listed in the village newsletter and on the village website. Leaf preparation tips can be found on the website.

## MOSQUITO ABATEMENT

Clarke Environmental is contracted by the Village to combat mosquitoes. If a resident has any questions or problems with mosquitoes, calls should be directed to Clarke Environmental at (800) 942-2555.

## SNOW REMOVAL

The Hainesville Public Works Department closely monitors weather reports and stock piles salt and other more environmentally friendly materials.

### Remember:

- No street parking is permitted during or after a 2-inch snowfall to allow crews to clear the road from curb to curb.
- Give snowplows room to work. Stay at least 100 feet away from the truck.
- Seniors may request that our public works department remove snow that has accumulated at the end of their driveways as result of snowplowing.
- If you have a contractor plow your driveway, please make sure they do not push snow into the street.
- Remove basketball goals from the curb and right of way.

## STREETLIGHTS

LED lights have been installed throughout the village to control costs and continue our efforts to support our concern for the environment. If you notice any streetlights damaged or non-functioning, please alert our public works department. You may submit a request for service on our website.

## TRASH, YARD WASTE AND RECYCLING

The Village of Hainesville provides residential trash, yard waste disposal and recycling services to its single-family home residents. **Townhome residents, please check with your homeowners' association.** The Village contracts with Advanced Disposal, to provide these services. This service includes a trash cart and recycling cart, as well as yard waste. Yard waste may be disposed of in brown biodegradable bags or 32-gallon or smaller cans marked as "YARD WASTE." The collection day is on Wednesday. If a holiday falls on a Monday, Tuesday or Wednesday, the collection will be done on Thursday. You may include one bulk item per week at no additional charge.

In addition, the Village provides a convenient way for you to recycle electronics and textiles with bins in the public works parking lot. Shoes and socks can be recycled in the Village Hall lobby. ## UTILITY BILLING

The Village Utility Bill is composed of water, sewer and garbage fees. If you have not already, please come into the Village Hall to establish your utility account. Billing is processed monthly on the 15th with a due date of the 10th of the next month. The Village offers a variety of payment options that are FREE to you. Visit the village website to learn more about these options as well as the usage charges.

## VILLAGE WATER

Your village water is supplied by our own aquifers. The Village monitors and tests all water quality to ensure the highest quality of water. Although the Village is responsible for maintaining the quality of the water distribution system (water mains) throughout the Village, residents of single-family homes are responsible for any water service connections from their house to the lawn connection.

### BICYCLING

### CRANBERRY LAKE PRESERVE

Cranberry Lake and the surrounding woodlands are a federally protected area. The glacier-formed, spring-fed lake is one of the purest lakes in Lake County. Its waters run to the Chain O'Lakes, to the Fox River, to the Mississippi River and finally into the Gulf of Mexico. It contains an endangered species, the Bladderwort, a carnivorous plant.

A mile-long woodchip walking path surrounds the lake. Enjoy the beautiful wildflowers around you and identify them on our wildflower sign. **Pedestrians only.** Motorized vehicles and bicycles are prohibited for the safety of pedestrians and to protect the path. All pets should be kept on a leash.

Work continues to improve the preserve and all woodlands, open space and wetlands throughout the village, by our efforts to eliminate invasive species and beautify the Village

### GREAT AGE CLUB

If you or someone in your household is 60 or better, we welcome you to our Great Age Club meetings and activities. Meetings are monthly at the Village Hall. Check the website for time and date. Meetings may include speakers, games and gab, or movies (oldies, but goodies), followed by lunch at a local restaurant (separate checks). Activities may include an annual picnic, progressive dinner, plays, tours and other outings. Updates can be

found in the newsletter and on the website. Attendance is free.

A pedestrian crossing sign was installed at Tall Oak Drive and Hainesville Road for your safety. Please push the button to start the flashing lights, but **DO NOT ASSUME THE CARS WILL STOP.** Cross with caution!



# POLICE AND FIRE SERVICES

## POLICE DEPARTMENT

The Grayslake/Hainesville Police Department is a professional law enforcement agency that adheres to the highest standards of professionalism. Their mission is to provide responsive and professional law enforcement services, preserve law and order, and to maintain the highest ethical standards. They are committed to maintaining the safest possible environment and to preserve Hainesville's status as a great place to live. The Police Department encourages citizens to call with their concerns. Whether the problem is speeding autos, stop sign violations, major intersection violations, hazardous parking violations or immediate safety hazards, the Police Department can investigate.

## HOW CAN I PROTECT MY HOME WHEN I'M AWAY? VACATION WATCHES

The Grayslake/Hainesville Police Department never takes a vacation, but because our residents do, they have a program to address this need. The Vacation Watch Program can be used by any resident of the Village who will be away from their home for no longer than two weeks and would like the added security of regular police patrols of their property. You must fill out a form in person at the Police Department, 10 S. Seymour Ave., Grayslake 60030. The vacation watches should never take the place of using light timers, stopping newspaper and mail deliveries, or having a neighbor or relative keep a special watch.

## HOW CAN I PROTECT MY PROPERTY FROM THEFT? THEFT PROTECTION

The Police Department strongly recommends that you keep your garage door closed whenever you are out of sight of your driveway. Remember to keep your vehicles locked at all times.

## FIRE DEPARTMENTS

The Greater Round Lake Area and the Grayslake Fire Protection Districts provide both fire and emergency medical services within our village. Due to constant improvements within both departments, insurance ratings have risen over the years resulting in a reduction in homeowners insurance. CPR classes are offered by both departments on a monthly basis.

# PERMITS AND ORDINANCES

## “WHY DO I NEED A BUILDING PERMIT?”

### BUILDING PERMITS

- Maintain and protect a property owner’s best interest
- Guarantee construction work will be inspected
- Identify deviations from approved plans and violations of the Building Code that may result in unsafe or hazardous conditions

The Lake County Building Department issues permits for any building or property changes including fencing, decks, patios, sheds, paving, etc. Remember to check the website before making any interior or exterior changes to your property. Permit applications are available at the Village Hall or on our website. Allow 7 to 10 days before issuance of a permit.

If you are having a contractor do the work, they will also need to fill out a contractor’s application, provide a certificate of insurance naming the Village of Hainesville as certificate holder and a copy of either another municipality’s current contractor, plumbing, or roofing license OR pay \$20.

### “CALL BEFORE YOU DIG!”

State law requires anyone digging anywhere, to call J.U.L.I.E. (Joint Utilities Location Information for Excavators) for underground utility locations. The J.U.L.I.E. phone number is 811 or (800) 892-0123. Calls are received 24/7. A 48-hour notice must be provided before J.U.L.I.E. will complete the utility “locates.” The J.U.L.I.E. operator will advise the caller of when the “locates” will be completed. This is a free service.

### CARBON MONOXIDE DETECTORS

Effective January 1, 2007, the State of Illinois requires all residents in Illinois to have at least one approved and operating carbon monoxide detector within fifteen feet of every sleeping room. The act can be viewed at [www.ilga.gov](http://www.ilga.gov). At the time of selling your residence, the building official will check. You must be in compliance before an occupancy permit is issued.

### CURFEW

The Police Department would like to remind parents that curfew is in effect throughout the year, including summer months. The curfew for all children 17 and under is 11:00 pm until 6:00 am Sunday through Thursday, and 12:00 midnight to 6:00 am Friday and Saturday.

### RENTAL OCCUPANCY PERMITS

A Certificate of Occupancy inspection is required for all rental property. As of 2020, a YEARLY Certificate of

Occupancy Inspection is required for all rental property. Call the Village Hall for more information.

An inspection by the building department is required and is done on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday mornings. The cost is \$50 payable BEFORE the inspection takes place.

### ON-STREET PARKING

Parking is not allowed on any village street between the hours of 2:00 am and 6:00 am and during or after a 2-inch snowfall. If you need overnight street parking, please notify the Police Dept. Dispatch at 847-223-2341. You can also apply for a yearly permit for on-street parking. Call the village clerk for details 847-223-2032.

For townhomes, please refer to your association for the specifics.

Parking on or over sidewalks is a State of Illinois violation and parking on lawns is a violation of a village ordinance.

### OUTDOOR WATERING

Lawn sprinkling and outdoor watering of trees, shrubs, etc. are restricted to the permitted days and hours. Under these lawn- sprinkling restrictions, odd numbered houses may water on odd-numbered calendar days. Even numbered houses may water on even-numbered calendar days. Holiday Lane Townhome addresses are determined by the first two digits. Cranberry Lake North and Union Square Townhome addresses are determined by the complete odd/even address numbers. No watering allowed between 9:00 am to 6:00 pm. Children’s sprinklers may be used not to exceed two hours in usage. Newly seeded or sodded lawns may be watered for the first two weeks not to exceed four hours per day. The watering restrictions are strictly enforced and fines are imposed. If you have any questions, call the Village Hall for clarification.

### PETS

The State of Illinois and the Village of Hainesville require all animals to be licensed (in the form of a rabies tag). Your veterinarian will supply these. Owners of dogs and cats are required to abide by the Leash Law whenever an animal is off the owner’s property. “Running at Large” is a violation of a village ordinance. Additionally, owners are responsible for the removal of their animal’s waste from public or private property. The Village only allows four dogs or cats per household.

Boats, their trailers, campers, etc. may be temporarily stored in driveways from April 1 to October 31 only.

between November 1 and March 31 only. No storage is allowed on non-paved surfaces or side yards, except, in some cases, behind a privacy fence. Snowmobiling is not permitted anywhere in the Village.
