LEAF VACUUM SERVICE – YARD WASTE PICK-UP SINGLE FAMILY HOMES

Leaf vacuuming service will be offered on Wednesdays starting October 23rd and ending on November 27th. Please be aware that due to the volume of leaves any particular week, the leaf collection truck may not always arrive at your home at the same time each week. Please have your leaves ready for pickup by 6:30 a.m. on Wednesdays. Last day for yard waste pick-up is also November 27th.

INSTRUCTIONS: Leaves should be raked into a pile or row within 3 feet of the curb but remaining well off the street. **Please make sure to keep the leaves on the parkway and not in the street.** Please do not mix large tree branches, grass, or brush with your pile of leaves as these items will damage the vacuum truck. **If the weather won't cooperate & there is bad weather on a Wednesday, the leaves will be picked up the very next day or ASAP.** Any questions call Advanced Disposal 847-623-3870.

CLOTHING & TEXTILE COLLECTION & REUSE-A-SHOE PROGRAM

Did you know that our Village participates in the Clothing and Textile Collection and the Reuse-A-Shoe Programs? The clothing and textile collection bin is located at the Public Works Building right next door to the Village Hall. Drop off new and gently used clothing items anytime and help save the landfills. Inside the Village Hall is a Reuse-A-Shoe drop off bin. Shoes may be in any condition for drop off. Please secure each pair of shoes together by either tying the laces together or placing a large rubber band around them.

211 HELPLINE NOW LIVE IN LAKE COUNTY

United Way of Lake County recently launched the 211 helpline services for Lake County. 211 is Lake County's free, confidential, 24-hour information one-stop shop for help with health and human services helpline. They can help with housing, utilities, food, crisis help, mental health & addiction, employment, disaster information, volunteering, personal, child & family support, education, government, legal & immigration, financial support, health care and transportation. You may access this program by dialing 211 to speak to a live person; access by texting to 898211 and then entering your zip code which will receive a personal response; or access their website at: **211LakeCounty.org** for further information.

Examples of How 211 Can Help You:

- Your electricity was just turned off because you couldn't pay the bill. Call 211 to find out how to get help catching up on your payments.
- Your Grandmother can't live alone any more. You wish you could take care of her, but you work all day. Call 211 to learn how to find a caring, safe place for her to live.
- You just got a new job but are not sure how to get there. 211 can send you to transportation resources that can help.

The comprehensive 211 service is multi-lingual with English and Spanish speaking staff, as well as interpretations to more than 150 languages.

RV & BOAT, SNOWMOBILE & TRAILER PARKING ORDINANCE

Boats, their trailers, campers, etc. may be temporarily stored in driveways from April 1st to October 31st ONLY. Snowmobiles and their trailers may be temporarily stored in driveways between November 1st and March 31st ONLY.
