### OVERNIGHT PARKING BAN IN PLACE

Since the beginning of Illinois' shelter in place order, the Village of Hainesville has not strictly enforced the overnight street parking ban. We recognized that with residents not going to work and students not going off to school, that it would more than likely result in more cars than usual needing a place to park.

Now that many have returned to work and students are off to college, we will, as of September 1, 2020 begin enforcing the parking ban. This means that, with few exceptions, vehicles may not be parked on the street between the hours of 2 a.m. and 6 a.m. If the situation changes we will re-evaluate this decision. The first date to circulate the nominating petition packets is Tuesday, September 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2020 thru Monday, December 21<sup>st</sup>, 2020.

The first day to file your Nominating Petition Packets at the Village of Hainesville is on Monday, December 14<sup>th</sup>, 2020 at 9:00 a.m. and the last day to file is Monday, December 21<sup>st</sup>, 2020 at 5:00 p.m. The Village Hall will be open Monday, December 14<sup>th</sup> through Thursday, December 17<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and Monday, December 21<sup>st</sup>, from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

### REGISTER TO VOTE

Register to vote at the Grayslake Library, 100 Library Lane, Grayslake, 847-223-5313 and the Round Lake Area Public Library, 906 Hart Road, Round Lake, 847-546-7060. For the November 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2020 General Election Voter Registration closes October 6<sup>th</sup>, 2020 with a deputy registrar. Lake County Clerk's office has a grace period registration from October 7<sup>th</sup> to October 16<sup>th</sup>.

### HAINESVILLE CIVIL WAR RE-ENACTMENT CANCELLED

## POSTAGE-FREE DROP BOXES FOR VOTE BY MAIL BALLOTS OPEN SEPTEMBER 24<sup>TH</sup>

Election judges will collect ballots daily and bring them to the Lake County Clerk's office for processing. ## LEAF VACUUMING SERVICES - YARD WASTE PICK-UP for SINGLE FAMILY HOMES

Leaf vacuuming service will be offered on Wednesdays starting October 21<sup>st</sup> and ending on November 25<sup>th</sup>. Please be aware that due to the volume of leaves any particular week, the leaf collection truck may not always arrive at your home the same time each week. Please have your leaves ready for pickup by 6:30 a.m. on Wednesdays. Last day for yard waste pick-up is also November 25<sup>th</sup>.

**INSTRUCTIONS:** Leaves should be raked into a pile or row within 3 feet of the curb but remaining well off the street. Please make sure to keep the leaves on the parkway and not in the street. Please do not mix large tree branches, grass, or brush with your pile of leaves as these items will damage the vacuum truck. **If the weather won't cooperate & there is bad weather on a Wednesday, the leaves will be picked up the very next day or ASAP. - **NO BUSINESSES OR BUSINESS DOCUMENTS** (includes home businesses)
- This event is free and for household personal and confidential documents only (taxes, bank/credit card statements, etc.). Please bring your sensitive documents to be shredded and **remember to recycle mail, envelopes, coupons, magazines, and other paper in your home Curbside Recycling Bin/Program. Virtually 99%+ of the paper from your home is recyclable curbside.**
