

- Initiated quarterly building inspections for our businesses and semi-annual for our residences.
- Studied and rewrote the Village's parking ordinances and signage
- Outsourced water billing
- Hired Houseal Lavigne as Community Planners.
- Developed and initialized the ongoing wetland channelization and clearing project.
- Increased the annual expenditure for repaving and crack sealing to \$250,000.
- Finalized the sale of the old Village Hall and brought Dunkin to town.
- Conceived and developed the Gathering Place.
- Established a procedure for the handling of nuisance ordinance violators.
- Terminated our CenCom contract for a savings of \$5,000.
- Developed and implemented a Sidewalk and Curb inspection and replacement program.
- Sponsored the Annual Civil War Re-enactment for 3 years.
- Had all sewer lines inspected and videoed.
- For the first time since our ordinances were codified, we had a complete review and updating.
- Had four balanced budgets while decreasing our tax rate.
- Received \$100,000 grant from our State District Representative, Sam Yingling, and a \$10,000 Gathering Place grant from ComEd.
- Sponsored Hainesville's first Classic Car Show.
- Performed a total update of the Village web site.
- Removed 88 dangerous trees from the Cranberry Lake conservancy area. (20 were replaced this year and another 20 will be done next year).
- Public Works cleared roughly 8'-10' of wetland overgrowth behind most homes that abut the wetlands.
- Had the tornado siren repaired and instituted an annual inspection program.
- Placed a list of ongoing Village Projects on the Village website.
- Developed a Rental Inspection Program. It will be implemented once Covid is contained.
- Began the development of a Village GIS information system.
- Got the state to provide new lane markings for the Hwy 134/120 southbound turn lanes.
- Added right turn lane at Hwy 120 and Hainesville Road.
- After experiencing a water tower failure, updated all the control systems and added redundant systems installed to lower the possibility of another failure.
- After a resident was attacked, rewrote the dog ordinance to make it more responsive to such situations.
- Provided two separate \$100 utility rebates to our citizens and businesses. Also, we waived business license fees, alcohol license fees, waived utility late fees and final notice fees.
- Conceived and organized a driveway repaving program for our citizens. Sixty-six residents participated.
- Renegotiated the Police contract saving \$108,000 over a three-year period. Also froze the Dispatching fee for 3 years saving \$13,574.
- Added the use of credit cards to our methods to have residents make recurring water bill payments.
- Set up the electronics recycling bin at Public Works.
- Paid off all of our debt. (Public Works Building and IEPA loan)
- Started saving required documents to a cloud-based system. (Laserfiche).
