HAINESVILLE SUMMER PROJECTS—2021

Now that the weather is warming up, the Village is preparing to start a number of projects throughout the Village. Below is our target list for this summer. You can keep current on the status of these projects by clicking the “Village Projects” button on our webpage (hainesville.org).

- 1) Repair curbs and repave the following streets: Emerson, Aspen Circle, Elk Court, and White Lane. We will also be crack sealing a number of other streets.
- 2) Repair the water tower and underground water reservoir.
- 3) Evaluate the physical infrastructure of the two waste pumping stations.
- 4) Continue the development of a Geographic Information System (GIS) which will eventually provide us with the geographic co-ordinates for all of our infrastructure.
- 5) Continue the drainage improvement of the wetlands. This is the 4th year of this program which entails digging channels in the wetlands to help improve the water flow, thus reducing the possibility of flooding. This work will be between Avon Ball Field and Elk Court.
- 6) Install erosion control plantings on portions of the Misty Hill east pond.
- 7) Continue the annual sidewalk repair program.
- 8) Parkway tree trimming and replacement.
- 9) Clear an 8-to-10-foot area behind the houses that back up to our various wetlands in order to prevent further incursion onto private property.
- 10) Begin year 1 of a 2-year project that will video all of our stormwater drain lines looking for damage and blockages. Fifty percent will be videoed and cleared (as necessary) this year.
- 11) Hold an ecological burn on Cranberry Lake.
- 12) Clear the Centennial Pond inlet and remove debris that is impeding flow.
- 13) Add more plants to the Gathering Place Gazebo area.
- 14) Connect the Public Works building to the Village water system
- 15) Apply a new layer of wood chips on the Cranberry Lake path.
- 16) Repair five deteriorating storm sewer catch basins.

Utility Billing Clerk

Experience with municipal utility billing and/or accounting experience is highly preferred. Other billing experience will be considered. This position is responsible for financial, administrative and clerical work involving all aspects of water billing including entering payments, payment arrangements, collections, processing billing, reports and mailings among other office duties. The ideal candidate should be detail oriented, able to work independently and to multitask. Should also be a self-starter and willing to take command of this position. There is ample potential for growth and advancement.

The hours for this position are Monday – Thursday 8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. The starting salary is \$17.00 per hour plus a \$500.00 monthly Medical Insurance Compensation Stipend. The village does not offer Medical Health Insurance.
