### **PLEASE ABIDE BY VILLAGE WATERING ORDINANCE!**

**ODD/EVEN: Odd addresses water on odd calendar days and even addresses on even calendar days.**

**Holiday Lane Only - address is determined by first two digits of address.**

**Water between (midnight and 9 a.m.) & (6 p.m. and midnight) on your day. There is NO watering between 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. on your day! Any day hand watering is permitted & children play sprinklers permitted up to 2 hours. Newly sodded or seeded lawns may be watered on any day for 4 hours per day for the first two-week period following the installation.**

## SHARE YOUR INPUT: HAINESVILLE ROAD IMPROVEMENTS

The Lake County Division of Transportation (LCDOT) is studying potential improvements to Hainesville Road. The project limits are Hainesville Road from Washington St. to Rollins Road in Round Lake Beach and Round Lake Park. This is an opportunity to rehabilitate the road and make safety and operational improvements to the corridor, such as adding turn lanes. A component of this study will investigate accommodating non-motorized travel along Hainesville Road.

The public is encouraged to provide input on existing conditions and suggested Improvements. **Ask questions and share your ideas no later than June 21** at [lakecountyiil.gov/HainesvilleRd](http://lakecountyiil.gov/HainesvilleRd). All input submitted through the website goes directly to the project study team.

Townhome owners make sure there are numbers by your garage or put the items by the front door. The driver will leave a receipt.**

- No businesses—Household personal and confidential documents only (taxes, bank/credit card statements, etc.).
  - Bring your sensitive, confidential documents to be shredded and recycled - up to 3 banker's boxes per vehicle.
- Remember to recycle mail, envelopes, coupons, magazines, and other paper in your home Curbside Recycling Bin/Program. 99%+ of the paper from your home is recyclable curbside.

- Confidential Documents for Shredding/Recycling—  
*3 Banker's Boxes per vehicle/ until truck is full.*
- Clothing—New, Gently Used or Worn (all sizes, fabric types). Your donations of new and gently used will be reused & allow us to recycle worn items received. **Bring Bagged.**
- Textiles like Bed and Table Linens, & Towels (including sheets, comforters, quilts, blankets, tablecloths) **No pillows, cushions, rugs or fabric pieces/scraps.**
- Reuse-A-Shoe: All types of Shoes/ Footwear-**Excluding rollerblades and ice skates.** Tie pairs together w/laces; if no laces, rubber band or zip-tie.
- Stuffed/Plush Toys & Animals —soft plush only.-**No other toys accepted.**
- Belts, Scarves, Hats, Backpacks, Duffle Bags & Purses
- Eyeglasses
- Hearing Aids
- Keys
