SEWER RATE INCREASE NOTIFICATION

Lake County Public Works Department recently completed a system wide Rate Fee study. As a result of the study, the Lake County Board approved sanitary sewer rate increases for customer's tributary to the Northeast Central Region and the Northwest Region. These increases are passed onto the residents and businesses. This increase is effective with the usage starting on December 1, 2021 and will be reflected on your January utility bill.

Northeast Central Sewer Region customers are comprised of the subdivisions of Misty Hill Farms, Deer Point Trails, The Sanctuary and The Settlement. The sewer rate will increase from \$6.474 per 1,000 gallons to \$6.564 per 1,000 gallons. The total increase is \$0.09 per 1,000 gallons.

Northwest Sewer Region customers are comprised of the subdivisions of Union Square Townhomes, Cranberry Lake (both single family homes and all townhomes) and the Commercial corridor on Routes 120 & 134. The sewer rate will increase from \$3.83 per 1,000 gallons to \$3.86 per 1,000 gallons. The total increase is \$0.03 per 1,000 gallons.

WASTE MANAGEMENT HOLIDAY SCHEDULE FOR 2022 FOR SINGLE FAMILY HOMES

Memorial Day – changed to pick up day Tuesday, May 31, 2022

Fourth of July – changed to pick up day Tuesday, July 5th, 2022

Labor Day – changed to pick up day Tuesday, September 6th, 2022

Thanksgiving – Monday pick up stays the same

Christmas Day – changed to pick up day Tuesday, December 27th, 2022

SNOW AND ICE

The Village does not allow parking on the street between 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. There is no street parking when we have a snowfall of 2 inches or more. Holiday Lane and Cranberry North Residents – no parking between noon and 4:00 p.m. the day after 2 inches of snow to allow for plowing.

HOLIDAYS OBSERVED

The Village will be closed Monday, January 17th for Martin Luther King Jr. Day and Monday, February 21st for Presidents' Day. Garbage pick-up for single family homes will not change due to these Holidays.

COURTESY SNOW ASSISTANCE

The Village has for years cleared snow from the "END of the Driveway" as a service to Senior Citizens and physically disabled. We intend to continue this service to our residents, but please recognize that this service is performed AFTER all other snow plowing and public work duties are completed.

Please note that if you are required to report to a job or some commitment by a certain time the next day the Village cannot guarantee this courtesy service in time for your needs. In these situations, you will need to make your own arrangements to guarantee consistent removal by a certain time.

VILLAGE NOTES

If your sump pump line is discharging into the street or onto a sidewalk, please move it as this freezes and creates dangerous ice situations.

It is against the law to push snow from your driveway into the street.

Snowmobiling or ATV's are not allowed to be used anywhere within the village limits.

Holiday lights and decorations should be taken down by January 31st.

Make sure your sidewalks are free of snow and ice. Also, let's look out for neighbors who might not be able to remove snow on their own by lending a helping hand.

Please clean snow and ice away from Fire Hydrants in your area.
