TREE DEDICATION IN MEMORY OF FORMER TRUSTEE GARY WALKINGTON

On July 23rd, our former Trustee Gary Walkington passed away. The Village was extremely lucky to have Gary serve on our Board for the years 1993-1997 and 1999-2014. On November 12th the Village had a tree dedication in honor of Gary. Gary's family assisted in planting two Royal Raindrop Crabapple trees in the Gathering Place. Gary is truly missed.

SEWER RATE INCREASE NOTIFICATION

Lake County Public Works Department recently completed a system wide Rate Fee study. As a result of the study the Lake County Board approved sanitary sewer rate increases for customer's tributary to the Northeast Central Region and the Northwest Region. These increases are passed onto the residents and businesses. This increase is effective with the usage starting on December 1, 2022, and will be reflected on your January utility bill. The increases are mandated by the County and the Village has no real voice in the matter.

Northeast Central Sewer Region customers are comprised of the subdivisions of Misty Hill Farms, Deer Point Trails, The Sanctuary and The Settlement. The sewer rate will increase from \$6.564 per 1,000 gallons to \$6.684 per 1,000 gallons. The total increase is \$0.12 per 1,000 gallons.

Northwest Sewer Region customers are comprised of the subdivisions of Union Square Townhomes, Cranberry Lake (both single family homes and all townhomes) and the Commercial corridor on Routes 120 & 134. The sewer rate will increase from \$3.86 per 1,000 gallons to \$3.91 per 1,000 gallons. The total increase is \$0.05 per 1,000 gallons.

WASTE MANAGEMENT IMPORTANT DATES FOR SINGLE FAMILY HOMES

Last leaf vacuuming is Wednesday, November 30th.

Last yard waste pickup is Monday, November 28th.

Christmas tree pickup is on Mondays, however, due to the holiday, the first pick up will be on Tuesday, January 3rd, then on Mondays through January 23rd.

LEAF VACUUMING SERVICES – YARD WASTE PICKUP FOR SINGLE FAMILY HOMES

Leaf Vacuuming Services for single family homes has been changed to Wednesdays, through Wednesday, November 28, 2022. Please be aware that due to the volume of leaves on any particular week, the leaf collection truck may not arrive at your home the same time each week. Pickup will start at 6:30 a.m.

INSTRUCTIONS: Leaves should be raked into a pile or row within 3 feet of the curb but remaining well off the street by 6:30 a.m. Make sure to keep the leaves on the parkway and not in the street. Do not mix large tree branches, grass, or brush with your pile of leaves as these items will damage the vacuum truck. **If the weather doesn't cooperate and there is bad weather on a Wednesday, the leaves will be picked up the following day.
