Approval of the Estimate of Revenue for Fiscal Year May 2025 – April 2026

A Motion to Award the Bid for the Well 4 Construction to H. Linden & Sons for \$1,441,944.00. Three bids were received. This is the lowest responsible bid.

Trustee Kriese moved, seconded by Trustee Koval Roll call vote: Ayes: Trustees Richmond, George Duberstein, Kriese, Georgeann Duberstein, Koval and Williams -6 Motion carried. Trustee Richmond questioned if reference checks were completed and Mayor Daley referred back to the letter of recommendation from Gewalt Hamilton in the board packets which addressed that issue.

A Motion to Approve the ILM Proposal for the 2025 Cranberry Lake Management – May Only. This single month approval allows the contractor to start services early in the spring. The rest of the service contract will be on the May agenda for the new Board. Trustee Kriese moved, seconded by Trustee Koval Roll call vote: Ayes (4): Trustees Richmond, Kriese, Koval and Williams Nays (2): Trustees George Duberstein and Georgeann Duberstein Motion carried. Trustee Georgeann Duberstein voiced her concerns about working with ILM and a brief discussion was held.

A Motion to Approve the Eubanks Environmental Proposal Fiscal Year 2025 – 2026 for May Services Only. This single month approval allows the contractor to start services early in the spring. The rest of the service contract will be on the May agenda for the new board.

Trustee Koval moved, seconded by Trustee Georgeann Duberstein Roll call vote: Ayes: Trustees Richmond, George Duberstein, Kriese, Georgeann Duberstein, Koval and Williams -6 Motion carried.

A Motion to Approve the Proposal for Professional Geospatial Services for Hainesville GIS Services 2025 – 2026 for Gewalt Hamilton. As an engineering software service contract, the Board is allowed to approve it beyond the current Mayor's term. Trustee Kriese moved, seconded by Trustee George Duberstein Roll call vote: Ayes: Trustees Richmond, George Duberstein, Kriese, Georgeann Duberstein, Koval and Williams -6 Motion carried.

Trustee George Duberstein moved, seconded by Trustee Kriese to adjourn the April 22, 2025 Regular Board Meeting. All in favor; motion carried.

Items the Public Works Department is Working on or have completed Since the last report.

- Well House 1 & 3 Both have been upgraded to LED exterior lighting and replaced all the existing photocells. K&M sewer and water replaced a main valve on well house 1 that had a major hole on the side. They are also going to start to replace all the nuts and bolts on the pipes and valves at both well houses.
- Wood pile the wood pile that was on the southwest side of the public works building
 has been chipped up and is now ready to be spread on our wood chip paths.
- Village Hall the Village Hall is having its parking lights fixed. Currently two are out and one is on its way out. Parts have been ordered and will be installed soon.
- Jet rodding- Lisk and Huntersway Dr. sanitary lines have been checked for any kind of obstruction, we have been noticing a major difference ever since we had Robinson engineering drop the level on the float at the lift station last year.
- Municipal Backflow-came to rebuild our backflow prevention valve at well house 3.
- Seasonal hires-Public works has been advertising for seasonal help. A handful of quality candidates have applied and are in the process of being interviewed.

- Winter is Hopefully Over- with that being said we are washing all of winter equipment and getting it de-winterized and ready for storage.
- Food trucks are Back!- Opening day is April 17th and are being hosted at the village hall and are expecting to have the public officially use the park in front of the public works building for food truck events.
- weekly duties: Dog stations, village cleanliness, picking up garbage around town, water shut offs, upkeep of the office, shop and vehicles, check storm drain and inlets/outlets.
